Join RMT Britain's biggest specialist transport union

Wave and pay proposals are a real threat to jobs on London Underground.

TfL is in the process of spending £70 million on developing 'wave and pay'

Oyster readers will be programmed to deduct money directly from a contactless bank-card. In TfL's words, the aim is to divert 24% of sales 'from rail stations' to 'online retailing': 'The TfL website will be established as the primary channel for customer service'.

With fewer Oysters to load at ticket windows and fewer machines to service, LU hopes this 'cashless' system will justify further ticket office job cuts. But one RMT branch has already pledged to challenge 'wave and pay'. The London Assembly have already questioned its impact on customers' service and security of data.

RMT is in a good position to get customers on-side in a campaign to defend LU ticket offices. Recruitment day last month was a great success

The November regional recruitment day was a great success with many Officials. Reps and activists turning up to help. The recruitment team met at Stratford and spent the day travelling around various locations on the network recruiting new RMT members from a range of grades and workplaces. The next recruitment day will be on the 31-1-13. Also a recruitment workshop is being held on the 14th Dec (see dates for your diary on left)

Train Op's to be balloted over management boxing day annual leave sell off proposals.

The RMT has served notice on LU over a ballot for strike action over London undergrounds unacceptable proposal for drivers to sell annual leave on Boxing day. Our annual leave is for quality time away from

work to spend with our family or friends and not for buying and selling. The union hopes that we will not have to take any action but we must ballot now in case any proposal is imposed upon us by management.

The ballot is about

defending our agreements, if LU get away with it this it begins the real erosion of our hard fought for terms and conditions. Ballot papers will be distributed this week. Please ensure that you use your vote and vote YES.
