ABM Cleaners Prepare to Fight Back

For Pensions, Sick Pay And Free Travel



The RMT are balloting our cleaner members on ABM because we believe our members deserve to be treated properly and equally with your London Underground colleagues. We are fighting for free staff travel, sick pay and proper pensions for cleaners. All cleaner members are strongly encouraged to vote in this ballot and also to speak to colleagues to encourage them to vote as well.

It is vital you return your ballot paper by November 19th. If you haven't yet received a ballot paper call RMT Head Office on 0800 376 3706.

Free Staff Travel

This could be provided at a stroke by Mayor of London Sadiq Khan.

It cannot be right that workers who are required to travel around

the transport network to clean numerous work locations on the transport network throughout their shift are expected to pay for the privilege.

The RMT believes the employer and the Mayor must agree to put this right and we will exert pressure, both industrially and politically, to make this happen.

Company sick pay

The most vulnerable workers in society are at risk of losing most while off sick.

It is nothing short of scandalous in 21st Century Britain that ABM doesn't pay you whilst unwell.

Outsourcing companies using the smokescreen of winning contracts that pay low wages with no sick pay entitlements should not be allowed under a Labour Mayor's tenure. *(continues overleaf...)*

The Law and taking strike action



The law provides protection of taking action covered under the ballot. The boss cannot discipline you for strike action. We don't expect employers to mislead their staff when we take action by suggesting our members could face sanctions other than having pay deducted. If your employer does do this contact RMT immediately on 0800 376 3706.

You have the right to take industrial action and you can't be legally forced to stay at, or go back to, work following a proper ballot process.

The ballot to win justice for you and your colleagues at ABM opened yesterday so you should be receiving your voting papers in the next couple of days.

This ballot is taking place as your union is fighting for you to achieve parity with your LU colleagues on a number of fronts including pensions, sick pay and travel.

RMT believes that the ABM cleaning workforce is being discriminated against when compared to their colleagues elsewhere on the Underground and this scandal must end.

Mr Khan promised he would improve terms and conditions for cleaners on LUL/TfL contracts when he met with our GS Mick Cash in 2017. To date nothing has happened. The RMT are demanding sick pay for our cleaners immediately.

Decent pensions

All workers are now automatically enrolled in workplace pension schemes - A good thing obviously.

What is not so good is that an employer the size and financial wealth of ABM offer a basic pension that is barely above the minimum required by law.

The cleaners produce the profits for the employer and ABM are a hugely profitable empire.

It is not unreasonable for workers to demand more of that wealth to be distributed to them via a decent workplace pension. A place to start may be something comparable to the London underground final salary pension scheme. It is time for ABM to provide a decent pension for all cleaners.
