# **Vote Yes to Strike for Pay and a Shorter Working Week**

**Your RMT NEC is urging you to vote YES for strike action to force LUL to address fatigue and the impacts of extreme rosters without making us pay for it.**

You are also urged to vote yes for action short of strike action, which is not to familiarise any member of staff at any location where that person would not work.

**LU management have tried to split us by making an either/or offer:**

**Either RPI + 0.2% a year for 4 years with nothing to address working hours**

**Or, a 30 min cut in hours in years 2 & 4 but with a pay increase of only 1.4% in those years – Well below expected inflation, in other words, a real-terms pay cut.**

**Management have offered nothing on Priv or the other parts of our claim.**

They hope an offer of RPI plus 0.2% will be enough to make us drop demands to address fatigue and working hours. This has to be rejected. It's not like they are offering some fantastic deal on pay—RPI plus 0.2% won't even cover the real increases in rents and other costs in London.

Pay must be protected as well as securing a meaningful cut in hours given as banked rest days. We will insist that any agreement allows us to discuss, function by function, how to use these days to reduce fatigue. We're not going to fight for these days just to let management impose rosters or tell us when we can use the time off.

It's a lie that there is no money to protect our pay while addressing fatigue and hours. LUL makes a significant surplus every year. The City of London that we serve is awash with cash. LUL should use its surplus to mitigate the impacts of shift work, not to subsidise the profits of private bus operators or pay of PPP debts to the City of London. Vote yes as soon as you receive your ballot paper.

# Vote YES - Strike to protect your pay AND to reduce fatigue and working hours

- ★ We generate £300m a day for London's businesses. We deserve some time off around extreme shifts without taking a pay cut.
- ★ It's a lie that there is no money to improve our working conditions. Inner London has a per capita income of more than £200K. That is similar to Monaco!
- ★ Every one of us generates £17K a day for the London economy while we work for LUL.

In 2017, the value of all bonuses paid in Britain was a record-high of £46.4bn, an 11.3 % increase on the previous peak in the 2008 financial year.

## TfL blamed for £886m 'scandal' of Tube upgrade delays

Four Tube line upgrades will be five years late and £886m over budget after "gross mismanagement" by Transport for London, the London Assembly says.

TfL spent £85m paying off Bombardier, the firm originally appointed for the work, whose contract was a "disaster for London", an assembly report said.
